



Steve WarrenVice President, Communications

Steve Warren is Vice President of Communications, reporting to the Senior Vice President of Washington Operations and Communications. In this role, he is responsible for formulating and implementing policies and procedures designed to support the Aerojet Rocketdyne brand and mission. This includes leading the company's strategic internal and external stakeholder outreach initiatives and serving as the primary media spokesperson for Aerojet Rocketdyne.

Prior to joining Aerojet Rocketdyne, Mr. Warren served as a strategic communicator and top public affairs advisor. He comes to Aerojet Rocketdyne from CNN where he served on air as a senior military analyst, helping explain complex issues of national security and policy.

Prior to joining CNN, Mr. Warren served 28 years in the United States Army before retiring as a colonel in 2017. During his career in the Army, he served in the most senior communications and public affairs leadership roles at the seat of government.

From 2011 to 2017 he served in the Office of the Secretary of Defense where his roles included coalition spokesperson for Operation Inherent Resolve in Iraq, director of Defense Press Operations at the Pentagon, and senior military advisor to the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Public Affairs. During his tenure, Steve was handpicked to serve in Iraq as the first international spokesman for the US-led, 60 nation effort to defeat ISIS.

Mr. Warren holds a Bachelor of Arts from the Virginia Military Institute and earned Master's degrees from the National War College and the Naval War College.
